The birthright of every child is to celebrate the heroes of their country and the beautiful attributes of their culture and history. On November 20th, Mexico celebrates the grassroots victory that was headed by such leaders as Poncho Villa over a corrupt government. Taking part in our local celebration of this great victory, Casa was well represented in the parade that took place on main street Anahuac. The children attending "Jose Vasconcelos Elementary School" at Casa (which has been named after Mexico's Secretary of Education) marched in their green uniform tops with navy blue skirts. As our middle school children marched, they displayed, for the first time, the banner announcing our recently acquired name: Abraham Lincoln Middle School. They marched in their handsome blue uniforms with red accent. Our children were notably the most orderly and well-mannered of all the school age children participating in the celebrated event, making us very proud to call them ours.

We continue to hold classes year-round at Casa, and as a result, we are seeing our children make great strides in their learning. Due to their previous circumstances, many of our children are working at catching up to the grade level appropriate for their age, and we see these children making significant progress. Tutoring assistance is in play every evening to help the children with their schoolwork. A Christmas break is scheduled starting December 19 thru January 4th with classes commencing Monday January 7th.

We experience the blessing of this wonderful gift each day while watching the children busily climbing, running, jumping and chasing each other with smiles stretching from ear to ear and hearts full of joy. While watching the children play, I often find myself reflecting on the various circumstances leading to the children being brought to Casa in the first place. These thoughts often lead me to the deepest gratitude to the Lord for the brethren at Harvest Church for making such an incredible blessing possible.

Among the many things we do with our children to facilitate recovery from the tragic beginnings that many have experienced is play. Play is among the vitally important activities needed for our children to recapture their childhood and learn very important socialization skills.

I cannot find words enough to fully express the depth of my appreciation of Harvest Church for such a wonderful blessing. The crew of nine who flew into Chihuahua to assemble the equipment did a stellar job, working long, arduous hours each day, making sure the assembly was completed within three days. I am struck by the name Harvest Church, as they are truly rendering a timeless harvest of joy, peace and happiness among our children. We are deeply grateful to all the members of Harvest Church for sharing their love in such a wonderful way.

New Vans for Casa

For some time now, the fleet of vans at Casa have shown serious signs of wear and tear, as evidenced by our ever-increasing maintenance costs and the general appearance of our vans. This holds especially true for the two vans that we use throughout the year to transport groups of missionaries and to haul supplies between El Paso and Casa. Our worst nightmare would be to break down somewhere in Mexico with a van full of visitors. Thankfully, this has never happened, however, we have broken down while hauling supplies.

Because our lack of confidence in the trustworthiness of the vans, we have, for some time, been setting aside funds to purchase another van. With the help of a “matching fund” initiative and the generosity of so many Christian brethren and Church leaders, our goal was met this month! We recently received a gift from the West Houston Church of Christ that put us over the top. In addition to the generous support of Christian brethren, major support was also received by the Southwest Church of Christ and the Casa de la Esperanza Foundation.

Shortly after acquiring sufficient funds to purchase the first of the two vans which needed to be replaced, a second van was gifted to Casa in the most unexpected way.

A Christian brother, and owner the largest pawn shop in America (his humble spirit desires that we not make mention of his name), has been growing the involvement of his company in the support of the Casa ministry. This brother views his company as simply a means to a greater end. His purpose is to glorify the Lord God by supporting multiple ministries throughout the world. Casa is blessed to be one of them.

We were told that a member of his staff would be looking around the Dallas/Fort Worth area to find a van for Casa. Several months passed in the meantime. Then one day I received a call that a dark green passenger van had been located — was that color acceptable? My immediate reply was absolutely! Not a problem with any color, actually. Again, some time passed without word.

Earlier this month I arrived at the Dallas/Fort Worth Airport to attend a training session on some equipment designed to manufacture block using soil, which is a method that is most suitable in third world countries. The purpose of the trip was also to assess the applicability of this equipment for use at Casa.

Upon arriving at the airport, I was met by the owner of the company and his staff person, who immediately told me that the deal on the green van fell through. My response was “not to worry, these things are in the hands of God and He will provide in good time”. As I turned to greet the owner of the company who was standing nearby, I was handed the keys to a brand-new passenger van sitting curbside! I was immediately overwhelmed with excitement, a deep sense of gratitude and a great deal of surprise.

Casa now has safe and reliable transportation for years to come to transport visitors and children and haul supplies wherever and whenever necessary.

A deep abiding thanks to the donor of this amazing gift that will bless the work at Casa for many, many years to come.



Reconstruction Continues

Casa's east wing, commonly referred to as the "Old Home Depot" (now that we have moved all the supplies and tools to the "New Home Depot"), is completely gutted and floor plans for this area are nearing completion. A trench, cutting through a cement walkway and exposing the old clay tile sewer line, is completed and a new 6" PVC line is being installed. An insulated roof is also in place and windows along the walls of the cupola will soon be in place, weather proofing the entire wing.

The east wing will house three high school classrooms, an extension of the current library, an arts and crafts room, and a studio office where doctors, PA's, dentists and ophthalmologists can perform checkups on our children. It will also house two infirmaries where we can isolate children with infectious conditions until they are healed and ready to be reintegrated with the other children.

- ■ ■ The ceiling lighting was recently completed throughout the entire first floor and worship area of the Church/Community Center building. The hot water heat registers are scheduled to be installed on the entire first floor over Christmas. Flooring for the stage and baptistry floor area has been purchased and will also be installed, followed by the installation of the baptistry. The next items to be addressed are the completion of the kitchen and bathrooms. Our prayer is that we will be able to hold our first worship by summer's end!
